

## Do Jews Go to Heaven?

There are two people groups, each with their own unique, identity, program, and destiny. The first, the Jew, is to the earth. The second, the Gentile, is to Heaven. God alludes to these two groups in the first words of the Bible:

**Genesis 1:1 ¶ In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.**

- There are two separate places: Heaven and Earth
- There are two separate people:
  - those destined to Heaven (Gentiles in the Body of Christ), and
  - those destined to the Earth (Israel: the Jews).

Both Jew and Gentile have the same father: Abraham.

- Israel: the son by the flesh
- Gentiles: the son by faith.

Speaking to Abraham, God alludes to this division.

**Genesis 22**

**:17 That in blessing I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply thy seed as the stars of the heaven, and as the sand which [is] upon the sea shore; .....**

- The sand of the earth represents Abraham's children of the earth: Israel
- The stars of the heaven represent the children of faith: the Body of Christ

## Jews

The Jews were always destined to the earth. Nowhere in the Bible is it said that the Jews have a place in Heaven. From the beginning, Israel was to live upon the earth with their Messiah ruling over them.

Jesus came to earth: He came to the Jews, not the Gentiles. Jesus taught the Jews, not the Gentiles, to pray:

**Luke 11**

**:2 And he said unto them, When ye pray, say, Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, as in heaven, so in earth.**

At the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus spoke only to the Jews. He said "blessed are the meek for they shall inherit the earth". And so Israel shall, not the Gentiles.

The Apostle Paul never spoke of such things to the Gentiles because they were a different people with a different program and a different destiny. The ascended Christ gave to Paul his ministry to the Gentiles and it did not include the Jewish program: tithing, water baptism, the law, the earth, etc.

Israel was always destined to bless the world, but due to their disobedience, and rejection of their Messiah, God put them away in unbelief; hardened for a season (The 2000-year Age of Grace), blinded to the truth until, in the end, a Jewish remnant will inherit the earth. Then, the nations will come to the Jews for blessing and the Jews will teach them.

## **Gentiles**

Not all Gentiles will find Heaven. Like Israel, only a remnant shall be saved: the remnant of the Gentiles who have a relationship with God through Christ, and have the Spirit of God. These are the sons of God: the Body of Christ who were always destined to Heaven.
