

# God Already Knows

Trying to understand omniscience as a finite human is beyond our ability, but consider this:

- You watch a movie and when it is over, you can see in your mind parts and pieces of the show. You remember the characters, what they said, and the various scenes throughout the movie. You can tell your friends all about the movie from start to finish.
- Now imagine that you have that same recall of the movie without watching it.
- And again, imagine the movie doesn't exist, but you know exactly what it will be about and every word and scene and character, etc.
- Now, you know every movie ever made and all the movies that will ever be made to the smallest detail.
- And you know every person that will ever watch every movie: time and date, and all their family, kids, and the future kids, etc.

Obviously, this example can't come close to explaining the depths of God. You can think of God existing in a different dimension than ours, where time does not exist, but our time wraps around on itself in a circular, never-ending stream, visible all at once, all the time.

God does not try to explain Himself in the Bible as we do not have the capacity to understand. Imagine trying to explain the entire world and everything in it to a newborn. And that doesn't begin to describe the eternity and complexity that is God.

We may never fully understand God, here or in the here after. but the Bible gives us everything we can know, and all we need to know to have a relationship with Him.
