

## The Jewish Hebrew Epistles

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These New Testament writings of the Jews (Hebrews, James, I & II Peter I, II, III John, Jude, and the Book of the Revelation), do not provide instruction, guidance, or doctrine to the Body of Christ, or the Gentile world. They were written by Jews, to Jews, with no intention of addressing the Gentile population then or now.

When Jesus said "it is finished" it was the end of the Old Testament story that began with Adam and Eve, the end of the four Jewish Gospels that finalized and completed the Old Testament. It was the end of the prophecies of the savior foretold, the end of the Gospel Jesus, and the end of the Jews. This end of the Jews also made obsolete the Jewish law and the Jewish writings that we find in our New Testament. These Jewish epistles exist for our information, to provide a glimpse into the mind of the Jews under the law, that we can juxtapose law and grace and see God's mercy toward us in His adopting the Gentiles into the family of God.

### Hebrew Religion

The Hebrew religion was superseded by the relationship with God through the Spirit of God indwelling man in this Age of Grace. This is the mystery hidden in the mind of God from the beginning of the world. This is the mystery given to Paul to take to the Gentiles. This mystery the Jews did not and do not understand.

The Spirit of God also brought an end to all the miracles, signs and wonders, including tongues and churches, tabernacles, temples and alters. Now, God himself abides in man through His Spirit - the same Spirit that is Christ.

The Hebrew religion is no different than any other religion in the world and their writings are all the same. Religions of all types focus on man and his efforts through works in doing something to please God or a god. This doesn't work. Yet, the New Testament Hebrew epistles speak of nothing else.

**Every single religion in the world - all of them - Christianity and Judaism included, offers nothing more than a fortune cookie theology that does nothing for anyone.**

### Knowing and Doing Good

**Ever hear of the *Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil*?**

Every person born into this world instinctively knows right and wrong - like a bird knows how to fly. All of the religions of this world are long on good things and thoughts and deeds; on trite little sayings, platitudes, laws, rules, sage old wisdom, old wives' tales, cliches, words of encouragement, cute little stories, and proverbial examples of what to do and what not to do; what to be and how to be. They offer personal works programs for you to try and attain some higher level of Spirituality. Catholicism, Buddhism, and the musings of Augustine are good examples. Judaism also speaks of good things and good works, but, like the rest, is void of God's Spirit and the ability to effect change in the lives of their followers. All the cults pick up on good thoughts and things and good works, and they, too, spout trite little sayings: this is their bread and butter. In fact, you can't have a religion of any kind without these good words to lure people into the door who are looking for change. Religions encourage their followers to think good thoughts and do good deeds in the hope of change.

## Changing Your Spots

The problem is not our knowing or recognizing or wanting good in our lives. Everyone acknowledges good and strives to do good and be good. The problem is our failing to do the good we know. We will always be wanting in the eyes of a perfect, almighty God, regardless of how hard we try, or how often we go to church”, or how many prayers we pray, or how many good works we do, or how often we go to communion, etc, etc. These false religions, with all their good words and works, are peddling a program of humanism in ***you trying your best to do your best***.

These religions seek to scratch that itch of desire for inner change, but are completely powerless to bring that change into a persons life. And no amount of religion will change that person or satisfy God. All religion can ever do is remind their followers of how far they fall short, holding out the proverbial carrot that is always just out of reach. These religions sell the **fantasy** of “***a better you***”. that no one ever finds.

## Just Say No to Religion

We do not need a religion to remind us how bad we are, or tell us to keep trying, or keep fighting a battle we will never win. We need something better, permanent, miraculous; something beyond those phony-baloney man-made religions that cannot help us. We need God: a relationship with God, and God indwelling. Good news! That is exactly what God offers to all who turn to Him.

The Christian religion maintains an errant focus on the obsolete Jewish Hebrew epistles, the four Jewish Gospels, and a false Gospel Jesus remade into a false god for their followers to worship. It is a false religion like all the others that fails to deliver any lasting benefit for anyone, and exist solely to distract people away from the One True Almighty God.

## It's the Relationship

Only in a relationship with God, and the abiding Spirit in man, can anyone ever please God, and there is no religion on earth that has, or has ever had anything like it, including Judaism and Christianity. Hence, we see in the New Testament the sunset of Judaism, the end of the Jews, the end of the Jewish writings, and the dawn of God's new message to us through the Apostle Paul to the Body of Christ.

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
