

What if They Never Hear?

What about the man in the wilderness who never hears about God, Jesus, or the Bible? According to modern pop religion, God condemns such an individual to a fiery after-life. But is this true? Why do religions believe this? What is the biblical truth on the matter?

God Saves

It is not true that people who never hear about God, Jesus, or the Bible are automatically doomed to an eternity without God. This is the made-up belief of a made-up religion.

Isaiah 59:1 Behold, the LORD'S hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither his ear heavy, that it cannot hear:

It is not true that people are automatically saved because they live in America, attend Church services, hear the Bible preached, read the Bible, own a Bible, are baptized (any age, any style), belong to this church or that religion, are nice people, good citizens, volunteer, love their family, evangelize, go on missions, do good works, raise their hands, babble incoherently, give money, pray a prayer, pray to statues, pray repetitious prayers with beads, teach Sunday school, sing in the choir, wear religious garb, practice celibacy, or live in a commune. Practicing piety, or fasting, or avoiding certain foods on certain days, and all the rest, does nothing to secure salvation and eternity with God in heaven.

Salvation is from God and He alone extends salvation to individuals based on their heart attitude alone which only God can know and judge. All the self efforts, self righteous and pious attitudes, self denial, and the severe treatment of the body are empty motions in a religion about God, or a god, and are as filthy rags in God's site. None of these things, separately or collectively, will save anyone. This is why the Bible does not speak of such things that are found only in false, man-made religions.

Salvation is childishly simple: when a person understands that their life falls short of what they know they should be, or senses God's calling them, all that person need do is turn to God.\

“God, Help Me!”

Simple! Two seconds. Answering God's call and turning to God results in eternal salvation and the gift of God's abiding Spirit. The Apostle Paul writes that God makes Himself known to everyone, even in created nature, and everyone is without excuse when they deny God and reject God. God has placed His signature on the heart of every human. Everyone can turn to God, religion not required or desired, and, in this day-and-age, religion should be avoided like the plague it is.

Romans 1:

18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in unrighteousness;

19 ¶ Because that which may be known of God is manifest in them; for God hath shewed [it] unto them.

20 For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen,

being understood by the things that are made, [even] his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse:

Paul, throughout his epistles, **does not say** every person on earth must hear about Jesus, else no salvation. Paul says a person cannot deny Jesus or his sacrifice. This was the problem with the Jews and Paul covers this in the New Testament book, Romans. The Jews knew Jesus, but denied Jesus was the Messiah. This is also the misunderstanding inherent in the Christian religion: they errantly believe everyone must hear about Jesus, else no salvation. This is a misreading of Romans 10 where Paul speaks to the Jews about their denial of their Messiah.

The truth is, never hearing about Jesus, never reading a Bible, never hearing a preacher, an individual defaults to Romans 1:18-20 above. This was the situation for 1500 years during which time there were no Bibles, people did not hear of or know about Jesus, there were no preachers or missionaries to cover the world, and there was no Protestant religion or Evangelicalism. Salvation did not begin with the invention of "Evangelicalism" in the 1900's as this religion would have you believe. That is unbelievable.

Everyone ever born has a built-in awareness of God, and a knowledge of right and wrong, of good and evil. No one needs to teach a person these things as they know instinctively, just as a bird knows how to fly. Everyone must choose what to do with the knowledge they possess. Everyone has the signature of God in their heart and an emptiness that God alone can fill. Everyone needs their Creator. That is how our Creator created us.

Now, let's look at why the Christian religions believe as they do.

Religion

Why do some Christian organizations believe in a formula that requires everyone to hear about God from another person, and not hearing, they are eternally doomed; that no one can know about God unless someone finds them, and tells them, and shows them a verse in a Bible? The answer is false religion.

The idea that all must hear to be saved is one of the many inventions of Covenant Theology, a line of thinking that has all but completely saturated religion today. In fact, it would be difficult to find a congregation of church-goers not afflicted, affected, or infected in some way with Covenant thinking.

Covenant Theology is a system of belief based loosely on the Bible, or more accurately, man's faulty interpretation of the Bible. The first seeds of Covenant-ism began to grow in the first century during the time of the Apostle Paul, and in time, spread throughout the world to become the foundation for all things Christian religion today. The husbandman of those satanic seeds was the Devil himself.

Fun Fact: The Christian religion, Protestant and Catholic, is found nowhere in the Bible. It is a made-up religion of many systems loosely defined by Bible verses taken out of context, and/or made-up traditions, superstitions, imaginations, mysticism's, stories and fables, extra-biblical writings, errant beliefs and rituals, all in a false religion of candles, statues, beads, chants, costumes, empty practices, wrapped in a form of liturgical pomp and show. Nothing here has biblical support and is totally void of God's Spirit. Mormonism was also created in such a manner.

A major problem with Covenant Theology is the inability to understand the Bible. Covenantals read the Bible allegorically and spiritualize verses they cannot understand. The reason for this blindness is their lacking the Spirit of God. Without the Spirit of God, no one can understand the things of God, and one of those “things” is God’s Word, the Bible.

I Corinthians 2:

14 But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know [them], because they are spiritually discerned.

Fun Fact: The reason Covenant religion does not have the Spirit of God is that they do not have God or God’s blessings any more than those who follow Mormonism or Buddhism. The reason they do not have God, in part, is their disdain toward the Jews. This is what they call Replacement Theology and more lately, Anti Zionism.

Another reason they do not have God is that they ignore God’s message He sent to mankind through the Apostle Paul. They ignore Paul because Paul’s epistles - God’s message to mankind - do not agree with the things Christianity wants to believe; chooses to believe, and choose not to believe. They do not want to believe what Paul says, they do not want to believe what God says. So, no God. This has been the plight of the Christian religion since its inception 2000 years ago.

Blind, lacking spiritual site, Covenantals must take their best guess at what they think a verse from the Bible might mean. What do you bet they get it wrong? In fact, the possibility of a Covenant theologian correctly guessing the meaning of a verse from the Bible without the Spirit’s leading would be like someone picking the winning lottery numbers every drawing for a year. Same odds. When you hear a Covenant sermon, read a book or commentary from a Covenant author, you can be sure that whatever they think the Bible says, it doesn’t. The result is their misunderstanding Scripture, verses taken out of context, and a lot of doctrinal train wrecks. Yet, these individuals, professing themselves wise, boldly state what they do not know or understand. They don’t know what they don’t know, but they will enthusiastically tell you what you should believe.

Fun Fact: 1600 through 1900 years after Christ, the man-made religion called Protestant Christian simply went through the Bible picking out various verses to create the hodge-podge of things they chose to believe, totally disjointed and out of context. Their belief system has no continuity with the Bible and so, it is a false religion, plain and simple. This is why Christians can believe

- They are the center of all religion
- They are the true Israel
- They are God’s chosen
- God rejected the Jews and transferred all the blessings He gave to the Jews to The Christian religion
- The Jews retain all the curses
- The seven Churches of the Revelation belong to them
- Deciding God did not really give the Jews the land of Canaan
- Jesus spoke directly to Christians 2000 years ago telling them to “GO YE”

- Everyone must hear else no salvation
- Baptism is a thing
- Tithing is a thing
- Mandatory Church attendance is biblical
- ...and I'm going to be an astronaut.

None of this is remotely true. It's fun to just say stuff. Just saying it doesn't make it so.

To a large extent, religion teaches traditions, repeating their false concepts and ideas of the Bible and God to their children, handed down through the centuries, generation to generation. Say something long enough and with enough conviction and it becomes truth, or somebody's truth, whether right or wrong, true or false.

The Confusion

In part, the Protestant idea that "all must hear to be saved" is a problem of interpretation, and that due to their lacking the Spirit of God to guide them. Their error stems primarily from two sources, both are verses taken out of context by the wayward religion of Christianity:

1. Matthew 28:19
2. Romans 10:9-18

Matthew 28:19

Matthew 28:19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: (see also Mark 16:15-18)

First is the often-misquoted verse Jesus spoke to His disciples only in Matthew's Gospel. This is the verse Protestant religions use to validate their errant belief that they must go into the world through mission work and find these lost souls who will otherwise perish without God. They believe this is a command to them from the Gospel Jesus Himself, and every saved individual must missionize and evangelize as a requirement of their salvation. They believe Jesus Himself gave the Christian religion their marching orders to "Go Ye" and make disciples.

However, this verse above has nothing to do with the Gentiles in the time of Jesus, or today. It has nothing to do with Protestantism or their focus on missions, or the concept of evangelicalism created not 75 years ago. Jesus did not speak His words to the Body of Christ, a people that did not exist at that time, did not give to the Apostle Paul this missionizing / evangelizing concept to take to the Gentiles when calling him to his ministry, and absolutely did not command the then non-existent, future, corrupt, apostate Gentile Roman pagan Christian religion, or its offshoot, Protestantism (that would not exist for another 1500 years) - to do anything.

Protestant religion simply read these few words from Matthews Gospel; words not meant for them, words meant to inform, not command, and put themselves into fictitious storyline that has nothing to do with them. They simply chose to build a false religion around a few words they did not understand, failed to validate their assumptions with Scripture, then decided to spend their life following their false religious beliefs and spreading their mistakes to others in a misplaced missionary zeal. The Charismatics, did the same thing regarding tongues and the Acts 2 verses. The snake handlers did the same with Acts 28. The Holiness movement chose II Peter to misinterpret. The Bereans and Grace Churches did the same with their interpretation of II Corinthians and a misguided concept of a Greater Commission they imagine Paul

giving their religion (an idea only 100 years old). The Amish and Hutterites took Paul's command to "be ye separate" out of context and condemned their followers to centuries of exile and a slow death through genetic disintegration. There are more. None of these verses or concepts or ideas exist in the Bible and these religions are non-biblical.

Consider In the four Jewish Gospels, during His three-year ministry, Jesus went to the Jew only, deliberately omitting the Gentiles and calling them "dogs", His words. Neither Jesus nor His disciples ministered to, or interacted with the Gentiles, avoiding them entirely, and referring to both the Gentiles and Samaritans as heathens, and sinners.

Post-ascension, Jesus commissioned the Apostle Paul to minister to the Gentiles with a new message that Christ never spoke to His disciples; information the world had never heard, information that God chose for the Gentiles to receive from the mouth of the Apostle Paul, information that had nothing to do with the Jewish Old Testament or the four Jewish Gospels.

That the Christian religion of today believes that Jesus, 2000 years ago, spoke specifically to them, a misguided, biblically ignorant group of Gentiles, without God or the Spirit of God, despising the Jews, preaching a false gospel, a false Spirit, and a phony Jesus, ignoring Christ's messenger to the Gentiles, the Apostle Paul - and they thinking Jesus commanded them into the mission field to convert the world to their brand of made-up religion is beyond absurd.

Much could be said here, but the short version is that Jesus spoke to His disciples, not the Gentiles. In fact, the four Jewish Gospels contain no commands or doctrines or instructions for the Gentiles at all, so, ascribing this verse to the modern-day false religion of Christianity is taking Christ's words badly out of context. Christianity assumes for themselves a mission never given. They call this "The Great Commission, a term that does not exist in the Bible. Nowhere in the Bible is there a command to the Gentiles in general, or the Body of Christ in particular, to "GO- YE", or missionize or evangelize anyone. Like the snake handling religions, or the tongue speakers that misappropriate verses from the Bible to create the false religions they believe, Evangelicalism lifts verses from the Bible, out of context, to build a false religion of their very own.

Fun Fact: There is no such thing as a "Great Commission". The term is nowhere found in the Bible. It exists only in the imaginations of the misguided religions that made it up, then chose to devote their lives to following it. It is a false interpretation and misunderstanding of something that never existed. It is not a biblical truth.

The Evangelicals are very disingenuous in their handling of Scripture. It is fair to say that all of the Protestant derivatives are nothing more than a random collection of Bible verses taken out of context. Case in point, they ignore the Apostle Paul because his epistles do not conform to their Evangelical leanings or their anti-Jew beliefs and talking points. Yet, God Himself sent the Apostle Paul to the Gentiles with His message for the nations. In the same way, Christianity also ignores Marks Gospel and his rendition of what religion calls the "Great Commission", because it doesn't fit with their made-up religion and self-appointed mission. Compare Matthew 28:19 above with Mark 16:15 below. Notice the additional proofs required for those who believe. Neither Marks version nor Matthews version apply to the Gentiles, the Body of Christ, let alone the Christian religion of today.

Mark 16:15 And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature.

16 He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.

17 And these signs **shall follow them that believe**; In my name shall they cast out devils; they **shall speak with new tongues**;

18 They **shall take up serpents**; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they **shall lay hands on the sick**, and they **shall recover**.

Note Studying the Bible, scripture always interprets scripture. For the Matt 28 and Mark 16 verses to say what these wayward religions believe they say, given the gravity of what these people think they mean, there would be numerous references throughout the New Testament repeatedly calling the Body of Christ to their mandatory, required ministry of "GO YE", and telling them to evangelize and missionize the world on threat of judgment from God. Instead - **Zilch!** There is **not one mention** of any such thing anywhere in the Bible, and certainly not in Matthew or Mark, or anywhere in the four Jewish Gospels. These verses have a completely different meaning and context when compared to the faulty interpretations these religions preach. What these religions believe is a tradition of what someone once thought the Bible meant, passed down through generations, and embellished over the centuries. It is not biblical truth.

Both passages, Matthew and Mark, relate to the same moment in Christ's earthly ministry. They are moments in history, descriptive of the Jews of that day, not prescriptive of future times. The numerous mentions of "shall" was meant for the Jews of a past time and does not include today, does not include the Gentiles, does not include the Body of Christ, and did not include a future apostate Roman pagan christian religion, or Protestantism, and these religions know it. However, they choose to ignore Marks version, preferring the more streamlined version found in Matthew. They can't very well go to the mission field and expect those who believe to cast out devils, speak in tongues, heal the sick, or drink poison and live. Since these things are not listed in Matthew 28:19, "let's just use that version and call it truth".

Fun Fact: Soon after Christ's ascension, the Jews were set aside, blinded, hardened in unbelief. Christ called Paul to bring a new message - God's message - to the Gentiles initiating the 2000-year Age of Grace.

The Disciples never did “Go Ye”. In fact, they never left Jerusalem, but stayed there, awaiting Christ’s return. Eventually, God scattered the Jews like chaff throughout the world. (70 AD and onward)

Very soon, at the end of the Age of Grace, in the coming millennium, the Jews will fulfill their destiny and “Go Ye”, carrying God’s message to the world, just not yet.

Second, as mentioned, Protestantism ignores Paul. But they will use a few verses from Paul’s epistles they can bend to suit their need, and always out of context. For example,

- Covenant religion uses Romans 10 to prove the requirement that they must spread the Word else people cannot find salvation, and
- Individuals must “confess with their mouth” and “believe in their heart” for salvation, and
- They believe “Jesus commands them to do just this”.

There is no truth in any of this as everything here is taken out of context. The Bible does not say what they think it says.

Paul to the Jews:

In Romans, Paul focused much of his attention on the Jews and their rejection of their Messiah, Jesus. Paul’s words in Romans pertained to the Jews, no one else.

Romans 10:9 That if thou (Jews) shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou (Jews) shalt be saved.

In much of Romans, Paul explains the difference between law and grace, couching the conversation in argument, as though convincing the Jews to believe in their Messiah as he repeatedly did in his early ministry. The Jews did not believe, but needed to believe. Paul here is not speaking to the Gentiles, or universally to all the world of all time, and certainly not to the Christian religion many centuries into the future, but specifically to the Jews and their denial of Jesus.

The Jews who denied Jesus must confess Jesus as Lord and Messiah. But they did not, would not, and will not believe until Christ returns, so says the Bible. For their unbelief, God turned the page, going to the Gentiles, initiating the 2000-year Age of Grace, rendering the Jews spiritually blind and hardened. The Jews and their writings now obsolete, God calls Paul. Paul’s letter to the Church at Rome address the Jews and their blindness and refusal to accept Jesus as their Messiah. These verses in Romans the Christian religion use to promote their missionary imaginings have nothing to do with Gentiles, evangelism, or missions: just the Jews in their unbelief and denial of Jesus, their Messiah.

Fun Fact: Peter's Jewish Gospel, to the Jews, not to the Gentiles, was "Believe Jesus as the Messiah, repentance, and baptism for the remission of sins." This is not Paul's Gospel to the Gentiles proclaiming Salvation by grace through faith, omitting water baptism entirely. Yet, many sects of Protestantism use this non-applicable verse for their religion.

God is Evident

Paul said in verses previous that "God has made Himself evident even in created nature so that all men are without excuse". This is addressing the man in the wilderness who never hears of God, Jesus, or the Bible, but responds to the God they can see and understand in their heart, visible even in created nature. This is not the case with the Jews. They heard, they saw, they knew, they refused. This is the meaning of Paul's words. The Jews were responsible and had to make a choice, and they repeatedly chose not to believe. This is not the man in the wilderness. The Christian religion cannot make claim to this verse for justification on how they see missions.

One fact these wayward religions cannot see and will never acknowledge as it would destroy their religion, is that for 1500 years, the vast majority of the worlds population never "heard", and did not have a Bible, and never saw a preacher. What happened to them? God knows how to save. Having the knowledge of Jesus, the Jews are not the "man in the wilderness". It is not a matter of the Jews accepting Jesus as much as the Jews rejecting the Jesus they knew, so Paul speaks as he does.

The Knowledge of Good

What Paul does say, speaking of the Gentiles - the heathen who do not have the law, but follow the law written in their heart, is that they are justified by their faith. Everyone born has the knowledge of right and wrong. Remember the Tree of the Knowledge of **Good** and Evil? The knowledge of good, right, and truth are standard equipment that everyone possesses and understands from birth. All the fortune cookie religions of the world write their good sayings, and laws, and rules, and platitudes, and sage-old advice, all a testament of the good that people know and understand instinctively.

Man's problem is not knowing or agreeing with these good words, but doing the good things they know. The good words are nothing more than ink on a page and cannot change a person. You will not change into a new spiritual creation, acceptable to God, by chanting or memorizing or repeatedly hearing these good words, or trying with all your mite to be good. This is impotent religion of every name and is pervasive throughout our world. Only the relationship with God and the abiding Spirit can change a man. This relationship is not religion. No religion has this relationship with God.

God judges the heart of man: what a person knows and what he / she does with what they know. Evangelicalism can not accept this as it would completely gut the foundation of their evangelical fantasy religion, that being the "GO YE" verse. So, they must either ignore Paul or redefine his words, and they do both.

Election

Paul also writes repeatedly of God's foreknowledge, that people are chosen, called, foreknown, elect, elected, predestinated, and that their names are written in the Lambs book of life from the foundation of the world. Paul makes over 80 references to God's foreknowledge and His calling in 11 of his 13 epistles, and there are many more such references in the Old Testament and the four

Jewish Gospels. These are far too many mentions to ignore, yet, Protestantism does just that: ignores Paul speaking of God's foreknowledge unto election, preaching instead only what conforms to what they choose to believe in a very narrow mission mindset and forgetting the rest.

Without Excuse

Evangelicalism also takes Romans 10:14 and following out of context to justify their mission programs.

Romans 10:

14 How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher?

15 And how shall they preach, except they be sent?...

Evangelicalism misappropriates and misinterprets these verses of Scripture, applying them to a universal audience, out of context, out of the textual flow, in a vacuum. They believe Paul is commanding Christians to the mission field. They say,

“Based on these verses, Paul’s own words, the Christian Church must send preachers, so they can preach, and so that people can hear, then believe, then call on the Lord and there is no other way under heaven that these people can be saved.”

That is not at all what these verses are saying.

Here Paul speaks to the Jews specifically who **did hear**, **they had the Scriptures**, **they had a preacher** and **must accept**, else no salvation for them, the Jews.

Here again, Paul is **not** speaking to the world in general for all time. Religions read the above verses and jump to the conclusion **“someone must go to those who have not heard else they will all go to hell”**. This is not correct as it contradicts the entire chapter in Romans, the book of Romans, all of Paul’s writings - God’s message to man, and indeed, the entire Bible.

In these verses, Paul specifically addresses Israel’s past obstinance and disobedience. God **did** send a preacher to call them, and they **did** hear, but they **did not** heed the call, just like Paul’s Jewish audience in Romans. If these false religions would just read the next few verses, but they won’t. However, we will.

Romans 10:

16 But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Esaias saith, Lord, who hath believed our report?

17 So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

18 But I say, Have they not heard? Yes verily, their sound went into all the earth, and their words unto the ends of the world.

19 But I say, Did not Israel know? First Moses saith, I will provoke you to jealousy by [them that are] no people, [and] by a foolish nation I will anger you.

20 But Esaias is very bold, and saith, I was found of them that sought me not; I was made manifest unto them that asked not after me. **(these are the Gentiles)**

21 ***But to Israel he saith, All day long I have stretched forth my hands unto a disobedient and gainsaying people. (The Jews)***

In Context

Paul, speaking to the Jews, looks to the past behavior of Israel to show the present-day Jews their rejection of their Messiah. Paul stands before the Jews, commissioned by Christ as an ambassador of God with God's message, preaching to them salvation by grace through faith and the mysteries of God, just as the prophets addressed their fathers. Even as Paul spoke, the Jews refused to listen.

Taken in context, Paul tells the Jews that their own history shows a continual obstinance and disobedience, refusing God at every turn. Paul says they - Jews - must believe the Jesus they know, and who they crucified, and who they continue to reject to this day. Paul here does not address the Gentile Christian church down the street or throughout time, or the man in the wilderness. There is nothing here about Gentiles, or the Body of Christ, or missions, or evangelicalism. Yet, the Christian church does not understand these verses, takes them out of context, and leads their congregations astray. In this, they are as blind as the Jews.

These words have been around for 500 years, yet, Christianity still makes these ridiculous mistakes!

Fun Fact: Christianity in all of its many forms is not a valid expression of biblical truth.

Fun Fact: The Covenant Christian religion is nothing more than a random collection of Bible verses taken out of context.

Combine this "out of context" understanding of the Bible, misunderstanding the "Go Ye" verse in Matthew 28, tell people this means everyone everywhere today, that Jesus Himself was speaking to Christians, and you have yourself a false religion complete with false doctrines, a false mission, a false gospel, and a false Jesus who never said any such thing to them.

To add insult to injury, in far too many cases, these errant religions proffer their phony Jesus as the focus of worship; as a false god to distract people from the one true God.

Notice: Paul never sends the Body of Christ into the mission field or demands personal evangelism, and nowhere in his 13 epistles will you find such an idea.

The verse quoted earlier "all men know and are without excuse" is never taught – or mentioned in Christian religions because it contradicts much of their faulty belief system. In fact, many of these religions omit Paul entirely, save a few verses taken out of context that they bend to fit the need of the moment, and to promote and support their flawed missions agenda. This is strange since the ascended Christ specifically called Paul to minister specifically to the Gentiles with God's message to mankind, and what Paul received has nothing to do with what the Christian religion of today, or yesterday, believes. Yet, the religious of today never hear of Paul.

This is all by design of the master deceiver who will go to any lengths to keep God's truth from the world. It's just a bonus for him that Christianity promotes his cause. Think termite bait traps.

A Faulty Mission Message

These false religions spread their false gospel messages and their misunderstandings of the Bible throughout the world.

Religion believes and considers everyone lost unless they hear the salvation message, and preferably from someone of their denomination and from their own church. They take their message to the world through many missionaries and missionary endeavors. They also insist on a personal evangelistic effort from their congregations; an idea that did not exist 100 years ago.

With little to no understanding of the Bible, and faulty misconceptions and errant doctrines such as Anti-Zionism, Covenant Theology, infant baptism, adult baptism, a flawed foundation in the four Jewish Gospels, misunderstanding and misdefining the Gospel Jesus, no Apostle Paul, Replacement Theology, Amillennialism, and much more, the question must be asked: what message are these mission-minded zealots in their false religions taking to the people of the world? Listen to the Apostle Paul's words regarding these false teachers:

Galatians 1:6 ¶ I marvel that ye are so soon removed from him that called you into the grace of Christ unto another gospel:

7 Which is not another; but there be some that trouble you, and would pervert the gospel of Christ.

8 But though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed.

9 As we said before, so say I now again, If any [man] preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed.

II Corinthians 11:4 For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with him.

God, through Paul, is here speaking to every generation of religious zealots who twist the truth and spread a false gospel, a false Jesus, and a false Spirit. It must be said that these individuals and

institutions, through their ignorance, are not doing God's work, but promoting Satan's ongoing agenda of blinding people to the truth, binding them to a lie in false religion, and turning them away from the one true God. This is the satanic agenda and mission hidden in the Christian religion and Covenant Theology.

Fun Fact: If the Apostle Paul were with us today, he would tell his churches to have nothing to do with the religion called Christian. And he would throw in an anathema or two for good measure.

23 **And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.**

Think about it.

What religion do you belong to? Which church do you attend? How accurate is their understanding of the Bible? How accurate is your understanding of God and His Word?

There are many religions about God, but only one relationship with God.

You're eternity is at stake.

Dump the false religions of today. Turn to the one true God, receive His Spirit, become a Biblicist, and learn the Bible and the truth from God as He wrote it to you.
