

Without Paul

The state of Christian religion today is such because, in part, it ignores the Apostle Paul. Really, they are ignoring God. God gave to Paul the message He wanted the Gentile world to hear. But, the Christian religion does not want to hear God's message, preferring instead to believe the ideas, concepts, and interpretation of the Bible they choose in their made-up religions. This is by design.

There is a powerful satanic force at work in our world that does not want anyone to know Paul; to hear his Gospel message, or receive the mystery given to him by the ascended Christ. This world-force has effectively silenced Paul for nineteen centuries, and in his place, created a world of false religions, false gospels, a false Bible, and a false Jesus in a religion about God, far from the all-important relationship with God.

Paul's church, The Body of Christ, remains in our world today, having the Spirit of God, the relationship with God, and the Word of God, understanding the Apostle Paul sent by God, and therefore we have the truth of God. These members of Christ's Church are the minority: a remnant. By far, the Christian religious of our day have no part in God or His Spirit, following a religion about God. or a God, lost in a satanic scheme to defraud them of their eternity with God.

While it is Paul that conveyed God's message to the nations, it's not all about Paul, really. Paul was merely a vessel Christ used; a nom de plume for the work God did through Paul. In this light, the question is not "without Paul?", but "without the message Paul was given to take to the world". God also foreknew the times in which we live: the apostasy of the church that the Bible warns must surely come before the end. God is as omniscient as he is omnipresent. The Bible, then, is simply a declaration by God to the humanity He created, of things that were, that are, and things yet to come.

It then follows that what we see in Paul's epistles were always a certainty. It was just as certain that some would see and understand the message, and that most would not; that the religion called Christian would ignore God and Paul and decide to follow a false message of their own making. But, there was never a moment in time where Paul's epistles could not, or would not exist.

What we see in Paul's epistles is God explaining to us today, in this specific moment in time, as though written just for us in these last minutes of man's history, His purpose and working in the world. God sent His Word into the world through Paul, written in his epistles, to explain like never before, and like nowhere else, the workings of a new era called the Age of Grace, the final 2000 years of humanity. Here, we find the mechanics behind Paul's Gospel and the mystery we have from God through Paul. Without God
