

## Organic Evangelism

**What does the Bible say about evangelizing, and how, when, and where does it fit into our lives?**

### *The Body of Christ*

Believers in the Body of Christ have the Spirit of God who works through us with our own special unique gifts, talents, and personality. As we walk in the Spirit, led by the Spirit, God opens opportunities in our day-to-day life and living commensurate with our abilities. We speak from the Spirit who dwells within; who animates, guides, guards, and directs our lives; yet we are completely free, choosing to follow the Spirit as naturally as breathing. That's what it means to be one in Christ.

In this, we do not "evangelize" as though it were some mechanical contrivance, or "holy mission", or biblical obligation, or as if we had some quota to meet.

**Fun Fact:** The Body of Christ is not a religion. It is a collection of individuals who each have a relationship with God and possess God's indwelling Spirit. This is not the Christian religion of today or times past.

### *Religion*

Religions of our day do not understand this concept of sharing our faith as they are not of the Body of Christ, do not have the Spirit of God, and misunderstand the Bible. They will say you MUST evangelize as a duty and a requirement of your salvation, it is your mandated mission as a child of God and a member of the Christian Church to witness and save the souls of the lost. They will tell you that it is your sole purpose in life: to share the Gospel with everyone you meet, otherwise there is no point for you living on earth. It is the only reason God is keeping you here. This is your work and you must do it. They will even direct you to misinterpreted, out-of-context verses from the Bible in an attempt to make you see their point of view, and persuade you to do their bidding.

**Yet, there is not one word of this anywhere in the Bible. It is all just made-up from someone's imagination. None of it exists.**

These religious zealots will tell you that God will call you to account for every opportunity you missed to share the Gospel; that your failure to evangelize every person you meet is you selfishly choosing to deprive that person of their opportunity, perhaps their last chance for an eternity with God, and that you, by your sloth, are willingly and deliberately condemning that person to Hell; that you, in your callous disregard for that precious soul, are deliberately drop-kicking them into the fiery abyss. No kidding! I have heard this spoken to congregations!

None of this is biblical, and nowhere in the Bible does anyone tell the Body of Christ to evangelize anyone. This is a made-up, false doctrine inspired by those who do not know or understand the Bible, who take verses out of context in an attempt to persuade you to do their bidding in their personal, imaginary religious mission.

### *Evangelist?*

The Bible speaks of the gift of evangelism. If you have this gift, Great! If evangelism is your calling, you would know it. You wouldn't need to wonder if you can or can't, will or won't, should or shouldn't, or how to go about doing it. If your God-given gift is that of an evangelist, you could not stop yourself from telling the world of God's Grace. This is exactly the way God has worked in the past with notable characters mentioned in the Bible, and God does not change.

**Consider:** Your uneasiness in evangelizing, and your inability, lack of knowledge, and your lack of success in evangelizing others, is God protecting others from you. You, belonging to the Christian religion of today, are sharing a false gospel and a false Jesus and a false message. God will not bless your efforts.

**Instead, receive God's Spirit and allow the Spirit to teach you the Bible. He is the author, after all. Once you have the truth, God can use you, and you will not need to force the issue. So, put that King James 2X4 away and stop whacking people with it.**

You, not having the gift of evangelism, and your religion bullying you with guilt trips to make you do something that is not biblical, not your gift, will offer to teach you to evangelize as if it were a recipe, like baking a cake. You cannot "learn" to evangelize by reading a book or a pamphlet, attending a class, a weekend seminar, or even reading the Bible. No one can teach you in a sermon or a Sunday School class to evangelize. In fact, when it comes to evangelizing, you can't do anything! That's why it is called a GIFT! (This mentality, seen in every area of these religions, is what is wrong with the Christian religion.)

Religions that speak of a “Great Commission” citing Matthew 28:19 and other verses, and other religions speaking of a “Greater Commission” citing II Corinthians 5:18-20, have taken their Bible verses badly out of context. Do not listen to them, and do not believe them. Do not trust them as this is not the only thing they don’t know.

**Consider** In the four Jewish Gospels, during His three-year ministry, Jesus went to the Jew only, deliberately omitting the Gentiles and calling them “dogs”, His words. Neither Jesus nor His disciples ministered to, or interacted with the Gentiles, avoiding them entirely, and referring to both the Gentiles and Samaritans as heathens, and sinners.

Post-ascension, Jesus commissioned the Apostle Paul to minister to the Gentiles with a new message that Christ never spoke to His disciples; information the world had never heard, information that God chose for the Gentiles to receive from the mouth of the Apostle Paul, information that had nothing to do with the Jewish Old Testament or the four Jewish Gospels.
