

What is a Biblicist?

Religion has been devolving for decades, and part of the process is word deconstruction: removing the meaning from words.

Today, most words in Christendom have multiple and diverse meanings and require more information and further explanation. Christian, church, salvation, baptism, and Bible are but a few examples.

One word that still has a straight forward meaning is “Biblicist”. A Biblicist looks at the Bible literally. Looking at the Bible literally provides a clear understanding of the text and a clear meaning to any given passage.

Most importantly, a Biblicist has a relationship with God. The relationship with God results in a person receiving the Spirit of God. The Spirit of God is the author of the Bible and the key to understanding the Bible and unlocking its secrets.

Beyond looking at the Bible literally, and having God’s Spirit to lead the heart and mind into the truth, the Biblicist actively, deliberately, and passionately seeks God, asks God, knocks at the door expecting to receive from God the understanding and knowledge he/she deeply desires. There is total faith that says God will give, and a complete, unwavering belief that the Bible is true and holds all the secrets that God will reveal. To one such as this, God’s child, God willingly gives.

Christian Religion

Covenant Theology makes up a very large percentage of the Christian religion to the point that most every religious group has some stain of Covenant belief.

- Covenantals look at the Bible allegorically
- Covenantals spiritualize the words to explain the text.
- They believe the Bible cannot be taken literally
- They believe the only way to interpret the Bible is through symbolism.
- They believe that no one can understand the Bible

- And they are right! Without the Spirit of God, that’s precisely the truth.

- They do not have the Truth of God
- They do not have the Spirit of God
- They do not have salvation
- They are the blind leading the blind.

Fun Fact: The Christian religion is found nowhere in the Bible: Protestant or Catholic. It is a made-up religion of many systems loosely defined by Bible verses taken out of context, and / or made-up traditions, superstitions, imaginations, extra-biblical writings, beliefs, and practices that have no biblical support. Mormonism is such a religion created in the same manner.

To make sense of the Bible, Covenantals must imagine what Scripture might mean. In a real sense, it is like they are reading a foreign language they can't understand, and guessing what it says. This is why there are so many versions of Christianity.

Fun Fact: The Christian religions over the centuries have despised the Jews. Christianity believes they have replaced the Jews, that they are the true Israel, and God did not give the Jews the promised land. For this reason, and more, God has never blessed the Christian religion resulting in no Spirit, Bible confusion, and fragmentation in their believes (if you ever wondered why their are so many Christian religions and denominations).

Being a Biblicist, then, is not the result of a course of study, a discipline, or an educational degree from an institution. A Biblicist has the Spirit of God, the author of the Bible as guide and tutor to unlock God's Word. The Biblicist perseveres in seeking the truth God has placed in the Bible for all who "seek, ask, and knock".

It's knowing and understanding the language of the Bible as personally taught by its author.
